Introduction :

‘Avhan’, call for disaster relief management, optly used word for the challenges. The challenge should always taken by the youth. It is expected by the society that the most dynamic team should come for the rescue in hard time. Maharashtra has faced the disaster in past couple of decades. These disasters had caused a monetary as well as human loss. This disaster, which is natural and man made creates chaos and havoc in the society. Maharashtra, the area prone to earthquake, famine and flood. This made His Excellency Governor of Maharashtra to create a force that will help the administrative system at the time of disaster. This team

will work as a disciplined force for the rescue management.

The then His Excellency Governor of Maharashtra Shri. S. M. Krishna conceived the idea of using youth of Maharashtra for this noble cause and finalized a mission to take over this difficult task. For this purpose NCC is chosen and a name is given to this team as "*The Chancellor's Brigade*". The brigade which is always ready for the rescue. This brigade became the most trusted team for common men of the society. NCC, the most disciplined youth force of the country has taken this stupendous task and successfully training the cadets from last three years.

Venue :

This year Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University has been chosen by His Excellency Governor of Maharashtra for this year's '**Avhan**' held on 9th to 20th June 2009.

Vice-Chancellor Dr. Nagnath Kottaplle has shouldered this task with his co-operative and enthusiastic team. This is the only event that has not yet been taken in the University. In his tenure he has taken 'Indradhanushya', West Zone Inter-University Youth Festival and his motivation made the authorities of the University to carry this crux of '**Avhan**'.

Aurangabad, a city of heritages, natural beauty and industrial development is the perfect place for the camp. NCC headquarter and its co-operation made this '**Avhan**' a memorable event in the history of Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University. The area of 600 acres with the hills around and natural location is the perfect place for the training. This area has historical importance with Buddhist Cave at one end and other end the famous 'Bibi ka Maqbara', and most important, the name which the University carries always prepared for the betterment of society i.e. Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar. This background

made the Management Council, Vice-Chancellor and all the authorities to make 'Avhan' successful.

Preparations :

The meeting after receiving the letter from, Raj Bhavan was organized, and Director Student's Welfare and co-ordinator N.S.S. have been given the lead role to carry this year's 'Avhan'. The able guidance and co-operation of NCC, made University to stand as a perfect venue for 'Avhan'. The residence of Cadets, food, transportation, training areas, and every important committee have been formulated and given the task in an important meeting. National Civil Defence College, Nagpur, is the only agency available for the training, has been invited with its staff and other amenities. The hostels of University and adjacent hostels of the affiliated colleges, have been used for the residence of the cadets. Girl cadets were also having a proper place in the University girls hostel (Appendix - 1 & 2). A central venue for preparing food is established at the open space in front of the guest

house. Transportation and other vehicles have been arranged by the authorities with the help of the colleges. The government agencies helped in arranging the training. It is appreciable that at one call the District Collector, Municipal Commissioner and other important government agencies have co-operated for this event. In all this event was the event of the city and the relation of the University authorities with the government agencies made '**Avhan**' a successful event. Mr. Rastogi, Dr. Palande and Mr. Alegaon had also visited the venues and satisfied with preparations taken by the University. They had also guided the organizing committees certain important things. The Vice-Chancellor Dr. Nagnath Kottapalle, Registrar Dr. Deepak Muley, DSW Capt. Dr. Suresh Gaikwad and NSS co-ordinator Dr. D. V. Mane personally observed all the things. The presence of Vice-Chancellor at every events with his team made every committee to participate in the event whole

heartedly. The committee were working as the cadets worked in the camp.

Participation of the cadets :

The participation of the Cadets is already decided by the Chancellor's office. According to the Chancellor's office the NCC Directorate called 20 senior division and 10 Senior wing cadets from each district of Maharashtra. 30 cadets from 35 district i.e. 1050 cadets and 150 cadets for administration were participated in the training camp. NCC Directorate had send its team with NCDC, Nagpur to facilitate the training. It was huge gathering at a time, for the authorities, it was a task to made the things available for the participants. This participants were satisfied with the facilities provided by the University.

Training :

The important mark for training was already drafted in the letter from Governor’s Secretariat. With the help of these guidelines the training programme was chalked out and was also approved by the NCC made ‘Avhan’ a smooth functioning camp with all its result. The venue around the University campus was kept ready by the committee. Lecture halls were provided for the lectures. The NCDC and NCC had taken up this task of

delivering motivational lectures, case studies of calamities, mapping of disaster area with the help of Remote Sensing Authorities, improvised explosive devices and personality development class with advance communication skill were organized. The syllabus of the training made the cadets well aware for the relief management.

The types of disasters, general orientation on disaster management, action plan for rescue operation, role of state, district, taluka and civil administration, incident and management system, disaster prone areas in the state, medical aspects cardio pulmonary resuscitation, use of bandages, disposed of dead, emergency methods use of ladders, ropes fire hazards respiratory and protective devices, water related devices the case studies of Gujrat earthquake, epidemic disaster, Tsunami, super cyclones and mechanics of calamities were taught to the cadets in a lecture and practical method by the NCDC authorities and NCC officers.

Apart from this traffic management, use of communication equipments tent pitching and talk on career perspective in Armed forces and Management fields with a blood donation camp was also organized in the training of 'Avhan'. The scheduled time of 12 days were completely utilized by the authorities. In this vigorous training work the University had to play an important role and the area was provided made this task smooth.

Arranging the training area :

The campus has the best training area. The surrounding to the campus had been prepared by the University for the training. The trainings was as divided by the NCC, NCDC and University authority had mainly divided into three different parts **(1) Outdoor Training, (2) Indoor training, (3) Lecturers.** For the training certain materials were given to the cadet. This was useful for the cadets in the practical training.

For the practical training the cadets divided into three groups by NCC and then they were sent on the different training areas with the NCC and NCDC officers. The training areas were neatly maintained by the University.

Outdoor Training : For this outdoor training viz. rescue operation, medical and administration with the aids made available for the cadets which were taken up by the training team. The areas on the University campus were distributed for different activity :-

- **For first aid** – two tents were pitched out at the open ground of the library.
- **Infront** of hostel no. 1 an innovative training area was introduced where cadets were trained for 8 knots and slashed.
- Humanities building was used for rescue and rope rappelling techniques.
- For water rescue operation University swimming pool area was made available. The whole water rescue operation and its related skills were taught with improvisation. Water boat rescue operation was taken up at Harsool lake. The boats were available to the University from the Aurangabad Municipal Corporation and District Collector office.
- In front of the University sports complex the training for tent pitching, communication technique, fire fighting and its practices were conducted. For the fire fighting techniques were imparted to the cadets with the help of fire brigade

of the Municipal council. The foam of fire fighting were trained the NCDC, NCC and Fire Brigade team.

The material for the training was supplied by the University on that spot, which was very systematic for the training.

Indoor Training : The indoor space of the University sports complex was utilized for the indoor training. Medical operations, administration phase in the rescue and relief management were taught with the audio-visual aids. The seating arrangement for this type of training was specially taken care and the comfortability of the dignitaries visiting to the area was also taken into consideration.

Lecturers :

This was the designed as a motivational part of training for the initial two days. The lectures were taken place in the Humanities Building lecture halls as well as in the cultural hall of the University with a capacity of 400 students at a time. The basic concepts of 'Avhan' the concept of disaster management had been taught to the cadets before taking from practically on the ground.

The halls were also utilized for the quiz competition, examinations and other competition amongst the cadets to inculcate the competitive nature in their personality.

Activities :

The activities of the training were taken place at the above said area by the NCDC and NCC officers the University has taken care of the activities and found that the personal commitment was the most important factor of the management. Certain skills of rescue management were trained to the cadets for practice frequently after the

training camp. The activities which were taught to the cadets as follows

- (a) Introduction to Disasters and its types, impact of disaster on human being all as well on the development of our country. Need and importance of civil defence, role of trained cadet in civil defence.
- (b) Challenges before the civil administration, their action plan and importance of support from common man. Disaster laws, and role of Government authorities from national level to village level in rescue, relief reconstruction phases of Disaster Management.
- (c) Risk management specially during search and different types of rescue devices used for different types of rescue. Importance of search and filling location.
- (d) Demonstration of different types of rescue and individual and groupwise practice session.
- (e) Use of self protective geared in different situation. Use of ladder's, ladder drill, Aligning ladder, adequate practice of each cadet were carries out.
- (f) In first aid Division wise classes were conducted. Injuries with respective type at harms. Types of

injuries and it's first aid like fracture, it's type, general wound, precious areas at our body and medical attention required. So to whom treat first is also one quest which got solution during training.

- (g) Importance of cardio pulmonary resuscitation, it's processes of appreciation without any errors, types of bandages with respective body part and its damage, bandages with foreign material in the body of victim. Firm mental ability required to treat wounded and burn patient. How to talk with the victim, how to get toward medical information of victim, such important aspects was taught and cross checked during competition.
- (h) Types of fire and how to combine with different types of fire. Use of fire fighting equipments, skills and competency required to fight with the fire.
- (i) Flood and water base disaster. How to prepared water rescue experiment's from domestic, household items, it's capacity and effective use. Water boat rescue, preparation of water boat it's accessories and require it is with rescue team. Use of rope, buoys in water boat rescue.
- (j) Fear has strong impact on the personality. It has made its place permanently in the mind of cadet. It

acts when proper situation arises. Under the influence of one cannot work to (overcome) all this emotion of each cadet rappelling, fire fighting. Water boat rescue, use of waster improvise water experiment's practical conducted for 100% girls and boy's cadets.

- (k) Inter platoon competition was organized to understand transfer of skills amongst trainee and the reset was very good. It was found the cadets were emotionally integrated with the dummy victims and lost their fear of blood spread. Girls and boys treated victims properly by utilizing optimum individual skill. Team dreamed together with ANO. Showed their generated team spirit, Aids, consultation, communication and there by made task easy.
- (l) Blood Donation Camp was organized in co-ordination with Government Hospital, Aurangabad by keeping heard above head girls and boy's cadet's responded to blood donation camp. 207 cadet's and one ANO donated their blood which totaled 72.800 cc. The authorities restricted other donor's due to lack of time. The quantity of number blood donor's exhibited devotion.

The inauguration ceremony on 9th June 2009 was held at CIDCO Auditorium (This was chosen in view of rainy season). The auditorium was almost full. The time scheduled for inauguration His Excellency Hon'ble Shri. S. C. Jameer Saheb Chancellor of the Universities and Governor of Maharashtra, Shri. Vikaschandra Rastogi Joint Secretary to Chancellor, Shri. Chndrashekhar Alegaon Joint Secretary to Chancellor, Mrs. Vijaya Rahatkar Mayor of Aurangabad city, Mr. Sanjeev Jaiswal, Collector of Aurangabad, Shri. Mahesh Mathur from NCC Directorate Maharashtra, Mumbai, Shri. Bhausahab Rajale, Member of Management Council, Mr. Pandit Palande, Pro-vice Chancellor, Yashwantrao Chavan Maharashtra Open University, Nashik were the guests of honour present on the occasion. Vice-Chancellor of the University Hon'ble Dr. Nagnath Kottapalle presided over the ceremony. After a floral welcome of all the dignitaries present, the festival was inaugurated by lighting the traditional lamp.

The guests delivered speeches that inspired the gathering. The audience was very much live. It responded the speeches with rounds of loud applause, laughter's, cheers and whistling. The president of the function offered his profound thanks to His Excellency the Chancellor for choosing the Institute to host such wonderful, event 'Avhan'. He extended his hearty welcome to all guests and ensured to take care of hospitality with utmost vigilance. The ceremony concluded after a vote of thanks by the host, the Registrar of the University Dr. D. V. Muley. The media given wise publicity for this ceremony.

The Valedictory function was scheduled to begin on 20.06.2009 at 5.00 p.m., at CIDCO auditorium. Dr. Narendra Jadhav, Hon'ble Member of Planning Commission, Government of India, was present on the stage as the Chief Guest. Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor Dr. Nagnath Kottaplle, presided over the function.

Among other dignitaries present on the stage were, Mr. Chandrakantji Khaire, Member of Parliament from Aurangabad, Mr. Mundhe Bhaskar Divisional Commissioner of Aurangabad, Col. Sunil Bhosle from NCC GP HQ Aurangabad, Dr. Deepak Muley, Registrar of the University. Capt. Dr. Suresh Gaikwad, Director of Students Welfare Dr. D. V. Mane, NSS Programme Co-ordinator of the University were honoured and were presented mementos.

Experience :

- 01) Duration of Camp to be increased to Sixteen (16) days.
- 02) Lectures can be arrange on the topic physiology of disaster victim.
- 03) Local government administration should be involved with its full potential.

The efforts were taken to allot a proper place to the training and accommodation transportation and food facility were the appreciating force to made this successful. The cultural activity also motivated the cadets on its first day.

Innovative steps :

- 01) Different outdoor training areas for different kind of training as per the strength and need of training.

- 04) Organised inflatable water boat rescue training in Harsool lake apart from University swimming pool.

- (i) **6 Buses (52 seaters) and 6 Tempo Traveller** : .
6 X Buses and 6 Tempo traveler including 8th & 9th June 2009 and during dispersal on 20th & 21st June 2009. Two trips were made for carrying cadets / NCDC Instructors / PI staff from University to CIDCO auditorium and back for Opening and Closing ceremonies on 9th and 20th June 2009 respectively.
- (ii) **2 X Canters / Trucks** : For ferrying of training stores / tents / training material from local units to training area site from 2nd June 2009 onwards, were made available till termination of camp.
- (iii) **Water bowser with Taps** : For drinking water at training area, one for Boys and Girl cadets each were provisioned from local army units. These vehicles were other than being provisioned for water supply in the living accommodation / bathrooms for cadets.
- (iv) **3 X Ambulances** : Three Ambulances along with doctors and nursing assistants were provisioned for evacuation of cadets to hospital / move of adets, during training in case of emergency, from 8th June 2009 from 1000 hours till termination of camp.
- (v) **6 X Light Vehicles** : 6 X light vehicles for ferrying NCC / NCDC Instructors / Officers from 7th June 2009 were provisioned for duration of 'Avhan' camp.
